Their intricate and lifelike portraits, set in unfathomable scenarios, incorporate prominent works from renowned artists such as Jeff Koons, KAWS, Antony Gormley, Yue Minjun, and Yayoi Kusama. Ye Hongxing, known for her vibrant and grand compositions, presents threedimensional sculptures crafted from recyclable wool. Inspired by the wonders of nature, these artworks resemble pixelated representations of corals, ocean floors, open fields, and mountain ranges. Through her creative approach, Ye Hongxing successfully strikes a balance between aesthetics and environmental consciousness, creating powerful visual impacts.

Sabrina J, a multi-disciplinary artist, presents fresh and daring explorations through her recyclable materials. Her pieces, resembling colourful birds spreading their wings, draw inspiration from nature's ingenious craftsmanship. With an acute sensitivity to blending different styles and integrating cultural influences, Sabrina J's creations embody a harmonious fusion of materials, textures, and mixed cultural references.

Leng Shu, a rising representative of avant-garde sculpture in China, seamlessly integrates the country's rich cultural heritage with a pioneering artistic style. Through exploration of various materials and breakthroughs in form, Leng Shu creates anthropomorphic figures that prompt reflection on humans' relationship with nature, the cosmos, and themselves. His unique language of contemporary Chinese sculptural style resonates deeply with audiences.

Clay Sinclair, an artist and engineer, weaves together visual cues in his paintings to convey distinct messages. His works exude radicalism through intense colour saturation, exaggerated slogans, and figures in various postures. Sinclair's proactive approach in the art world has firmly established his footing, and his artworks emit a powerful energy that transcends mere information.

Zhang Lehua, challenges mainstream societal thoughts through his rustic and humorous style. His satirical cartoon series, reminiscent of propaganda posters, delves into contemporary socio-cultural issues. Zhang's raw honesty and unique visual style have garnered attention and admiration from major galleries and collectors.

Collective Unconscious invites visitors to slow down and resonate with the images presented. These artworks, rooted in ancestral memories and collective consciousness, offer a deeper understanding of the human psyche and our profound connection to art and culture.
